- Students can apply using the Rutgers or Coalition application.

Requirements:

- Official transcript from every college you attended (transfer applicants only)
- Official high school transcript (or official GED results, if applicable) if less than 24 college credits are completed at the time of application
- Essay (required for first-year applicants, optional for transfer applicants)
- Self-Reported Academic Record—allows students to self-report their courses, grades, grade-point averages, and other academic information (first-year applicants only)
- SAT/ACT scores—optional for students applying for spring/fall 2022 (first-year applicants only)
